# **Definition** (Elwyn, 2012):


"An approach where clinician and patient share the best available evidence when faced with the task of making decisions, and where the patient is supported to consider options, to achieve his/her informed preferences."

# **Qualitative study** Rapid prototyping:

Step by step development of intervention, in co-creation:

- Parents
- Primary care midwives Obstetric nurses
- Obstetricians
- Hospital based midwives Maternity care assistants

# **Step by step development:**

- 1. Needs-assessment
- 2. First prototype of the intervention
- 3. Prototype testing and adjustants (several times)
- 4. Evaluation
- 5. National distribution

- Focus group discussions
- Nov. and Dec. 2016
- Content analysis



# **Process of SDM in everyday practice**

High need for SDM Advantages & uncertainties

3 steps SDM




**Parent:** "There is a choice and different options exist ... that's what my midwife told me. [...] But making a decision together or discussing what I find important ... well actually I just inform her about my decision, that's not really a shared endeavor."

Communication and trust SDM process needs improvement






